ASSISTANCE FOR CRIME VICTIMS

Chandler Police Department Victim Services Unit (VSU) assists community members as they cope with the effects of crime and proceed through the criminal justice system. Crime victims are provided support services, information, and community referrals to assist in their recovery.

SERVICES PROVIDED

Below are services available to crime victims and witnesses of crimes in the Chandler community*:

- Education on Victims' Rights & the Criminal Justice System
- Support during the criminal investigation and liaison with detectives
- Assistance with Crime Victim Compensation
- Information and referral to community resources
- Assistance with Orders of Protection/ Injunction Against Harassment
- Court accompaniment
- Assist with the development of a personal safety plan

**Chandler Police Department Victim Services Unit cannot provide legal advice.*

"Victim" means a person against whom the criminal offense has been committed or, if the person is killed or incapacitated, the person's spouse, parent, child or other lawful representative, except if the person is in custody for an offense or is the accused.*

VICTIMS' BILL OF RIGHTS AZ CONSTITUTION

A victim of crime has the right:

To be treated with fairness, respect, and dignity and to be free from intimidation, harassment, or abuse, throughout the criminal justice process.

To be informed, **upon request**, when the accused or convicted person is released from custody or has escaped.

To be present at and, **upon request**, to be informed of all criminal proceedings when the defendant has the right to be present.

To be heard, in person or in writing, at any proceeding involving a post-arrest release decision, a negotiated plea, and sentencing

To confer with the prosecution, after the crime against the victim has been charged, before trial or before any disposition of the case and to be informed of the disposition.

To receive prompt restitution from the person(s) convicted of the criminal conduct that caused the victim's loss or injury.

To be informed of victims' constitutional rights.

CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION (CVC)

Victim Compensation allows victims to be reimbursed for eligible out-of-pocket expenses that have not already been recovered through other sources, such as: medical expenses, funeral costs, lost wages, or mental health counseling.
