For decades, Neighborhood Watch programs have been the cornerstone of many crime prevention efforts. It brings together community residents and the police department to reduce and prevent crime.


Programs which remain active are provided neighborhood watch signs that are placed in their community by the City of Chandler.

What's the Process

The process of getting a Neighborhood Watch started is easy, but does have a few steps. The steps include:

- Contact your neighbors and see if they are interested in participating.
- Contact your Crime Prevention Officer with some dates in mind to host your Neighborhood Watch presentation.
- Complete the Neighborhood Watch invitation letter on our website and send it to all your neighbors.
- Your Neighborhood Watch meeting is hosted by **You**. The officer is your guest speaker and will discuss crime prevention information and tips.



- Once the presentation is complete, and your questions are answered, the officer will leave the meeting to allow you time to focus on getting to know one another.
